Isles Center for Energy and Environmental Training (CEET)provides professional training in energy efficiency and healthy homes.

New and incumbent workers pursue nationally recognized certifications that include classroom, laboratory and field experiences in areas such as energy efficiency, heating and cooling, ventilation, radon and lead safe renovation and repair.

As New Jersey's training center for the National Center for Healthy Housing, CEET provides training throughout the state on environmental hazards (lead, asthma triggers, mold, etc.) to contractors, health workers, building inspectors and others who may come in contact with urban dwellings.

To date, CEET has provided training to more than 1,800 people, including job training for unemployed individuals as well as additional training for existing workers in the energy efficiency, renewable energy, healthy homes, or related construction fields.
